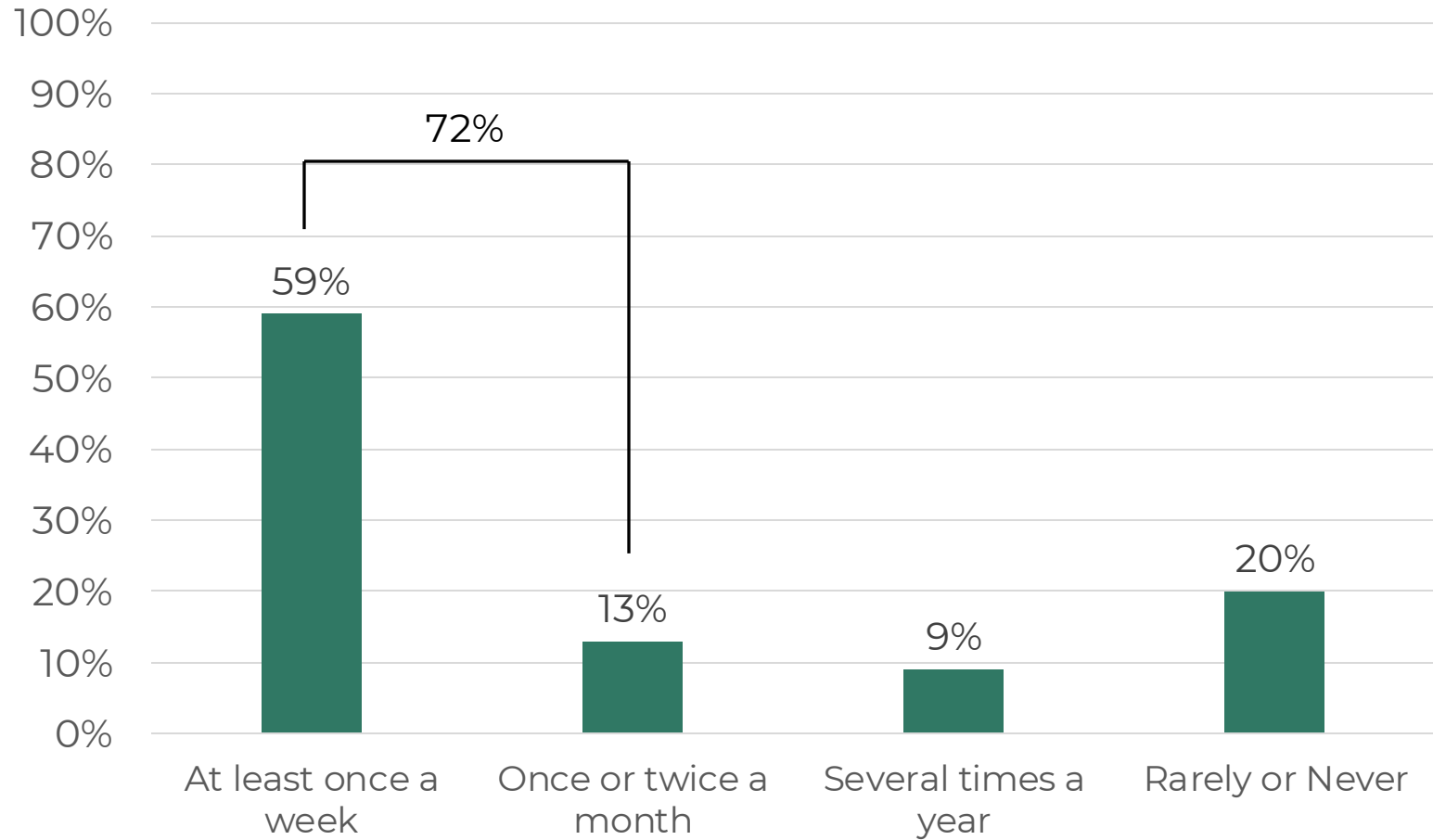

Methodology

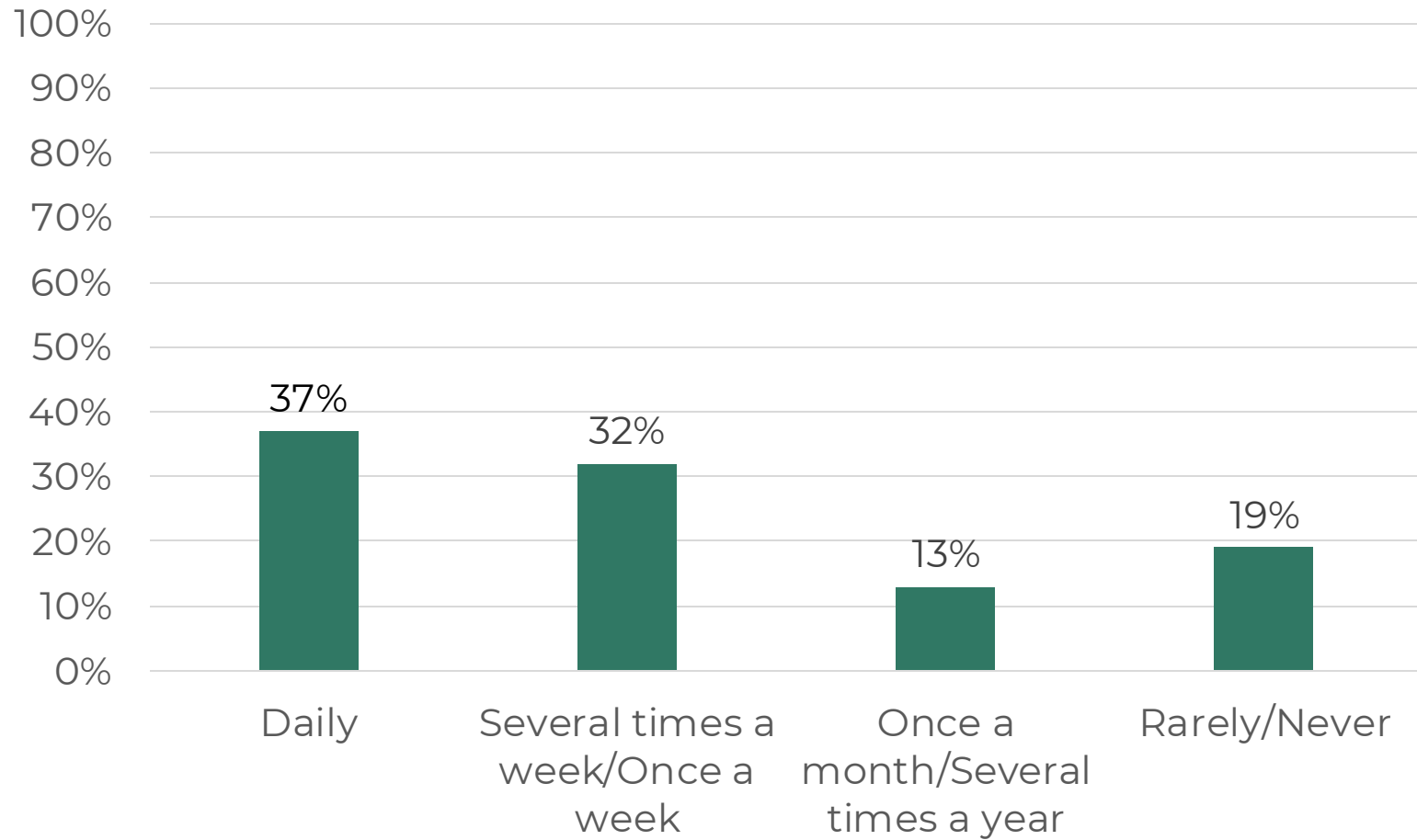
The study was originated and commissioned by the Institute for Faith & Culture

- The online survey of 1,000 American Evangelicals was conducted July 18 – August 2, 2024, using a national pre-recruited panel
- Respondents were screened to include those who identified as Protestant/non-denominational and whose church is non-denominational or in a denomination that is within the evangelical religious tradition
- Quotas and slight weights were used to balance gender, age, region, ethnicity, education to more accurately reflect the population
- The completed sample is 1,000 surveys
- The sample provides 95% confidence that the sampling error from the panel does not exceed $\pm 3.3\%$ This margin of error accounts for the effect of weighting
- Margins of error are higher in sub-groups

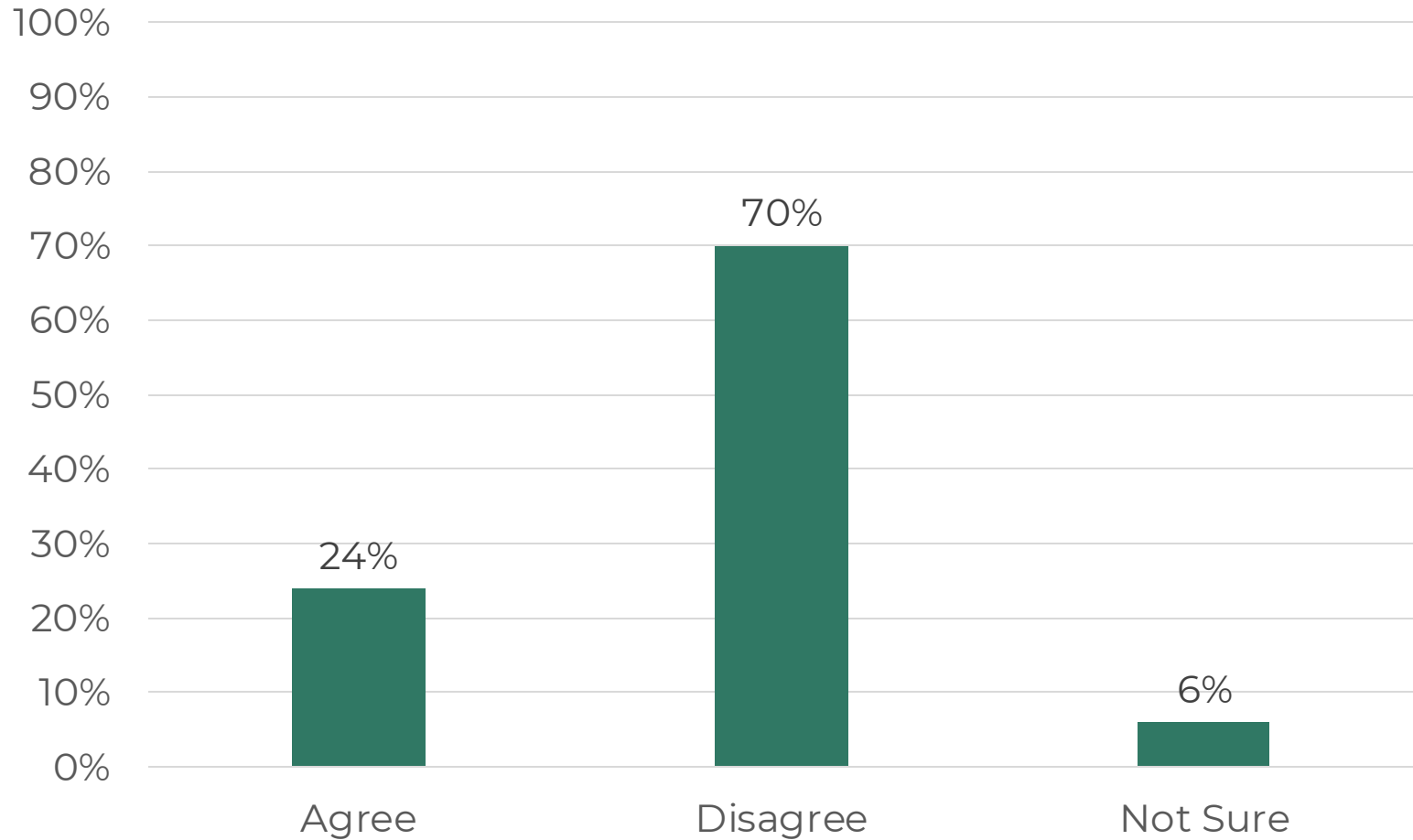
What percentage of evangelicals attend worship services at least once a month?



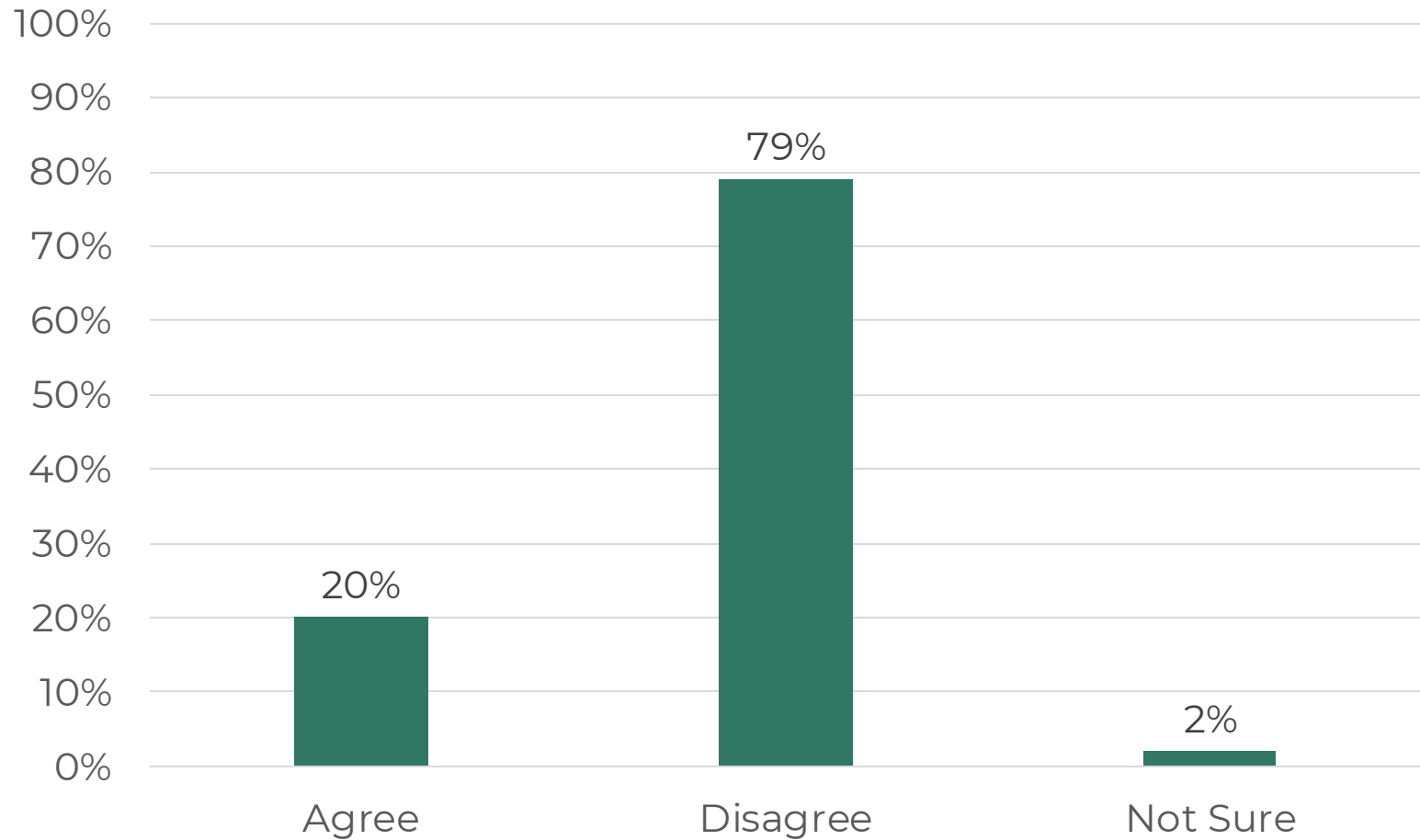
What percentage of evangelicals personally read the Bible daily?



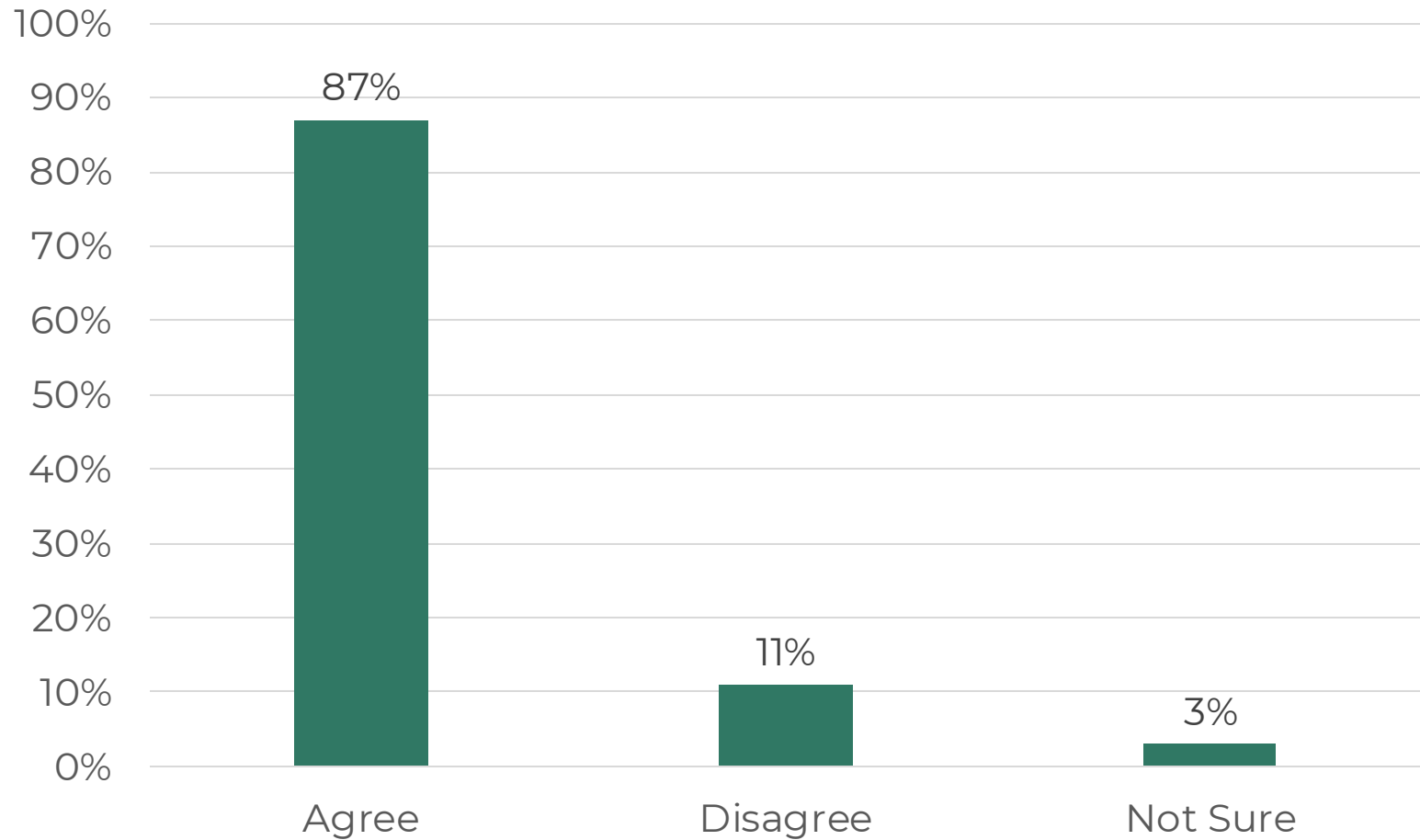
What percentage of evangelicals have given up on our culture and don't try to influence it in any way?



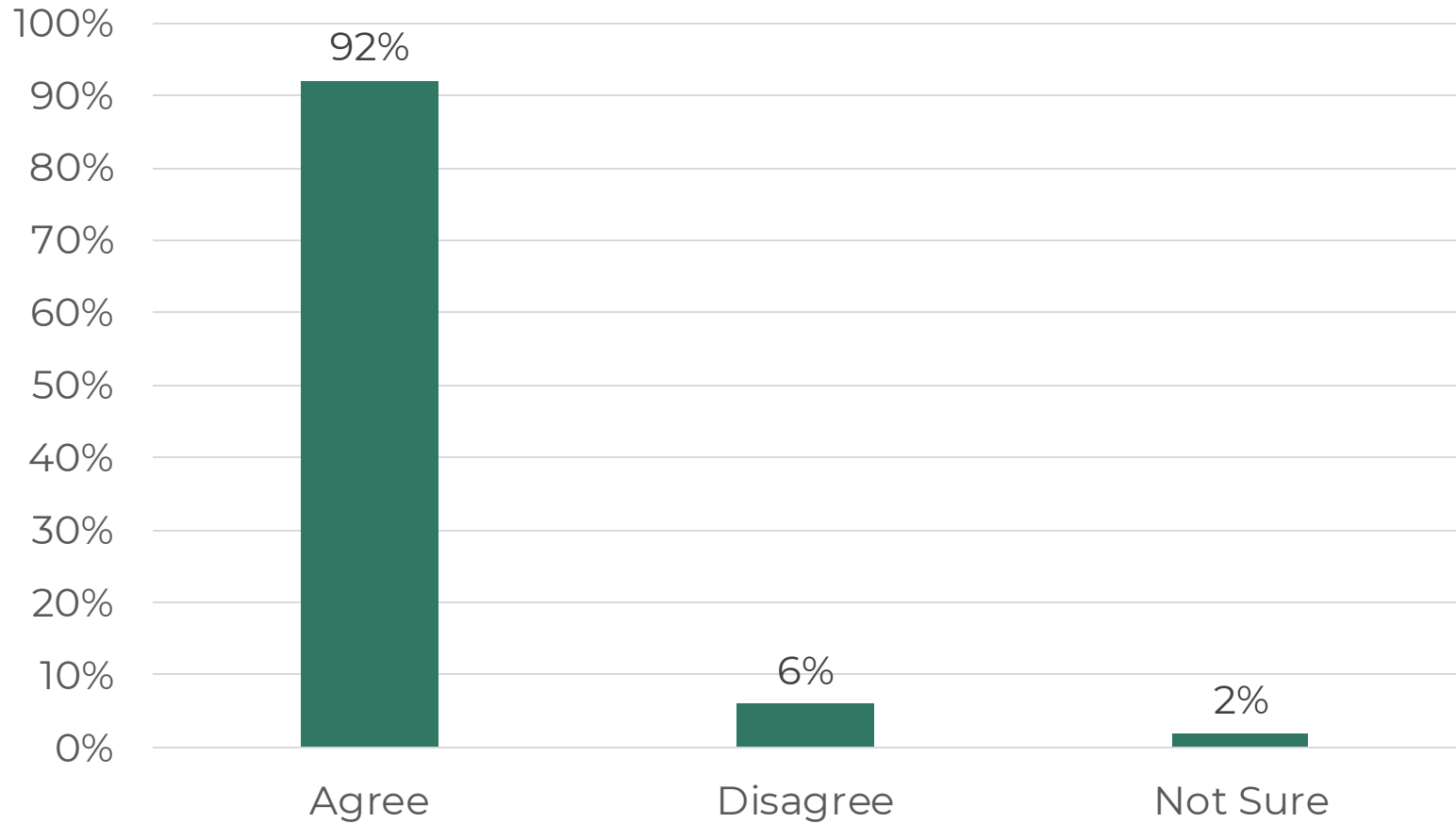
What percentage of evangelicals believe the Bible is a good foundation but not relevant for most daily decisions?



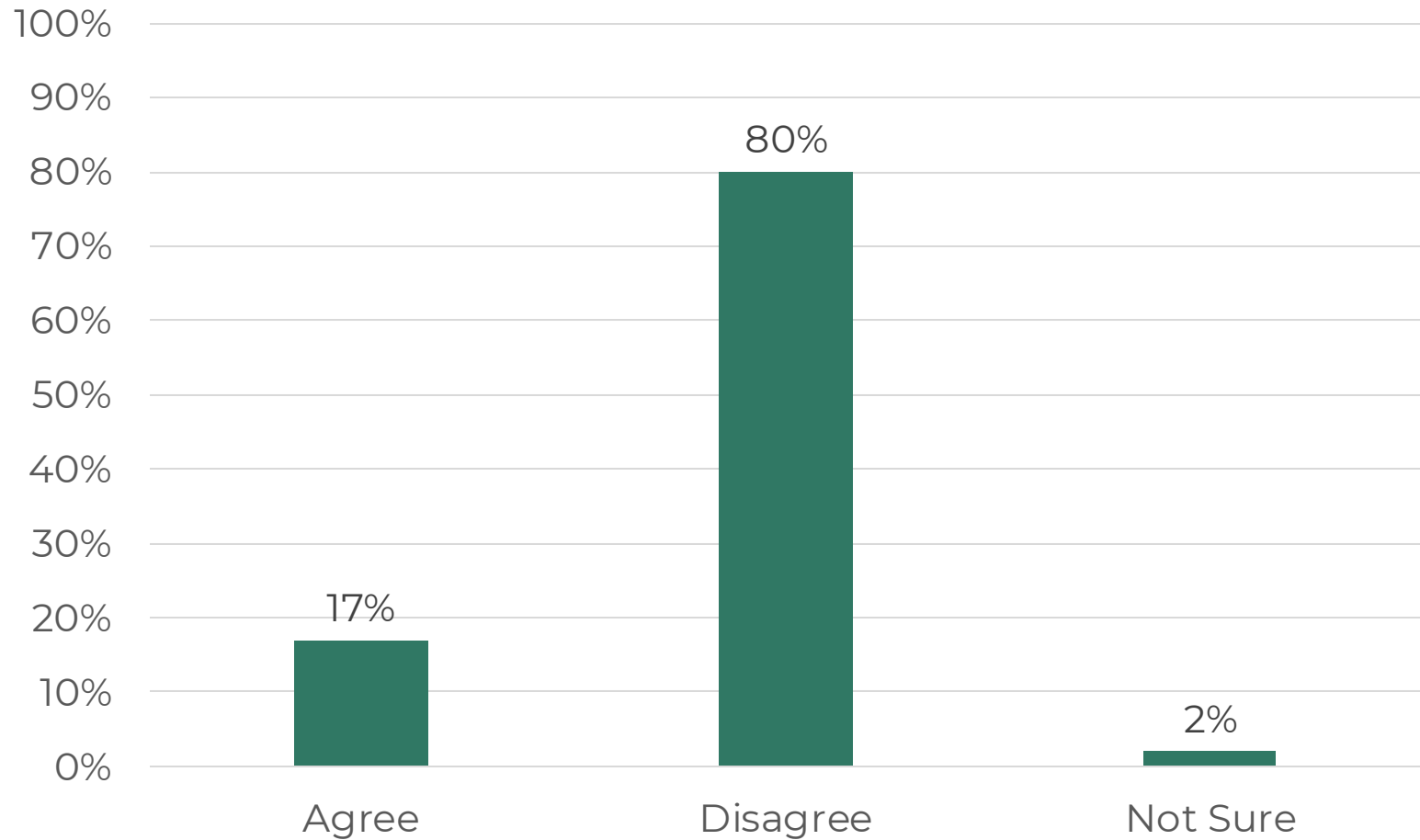
What percentage of evangelicals believe only the Bible can define what a life of faith and service to God includes?



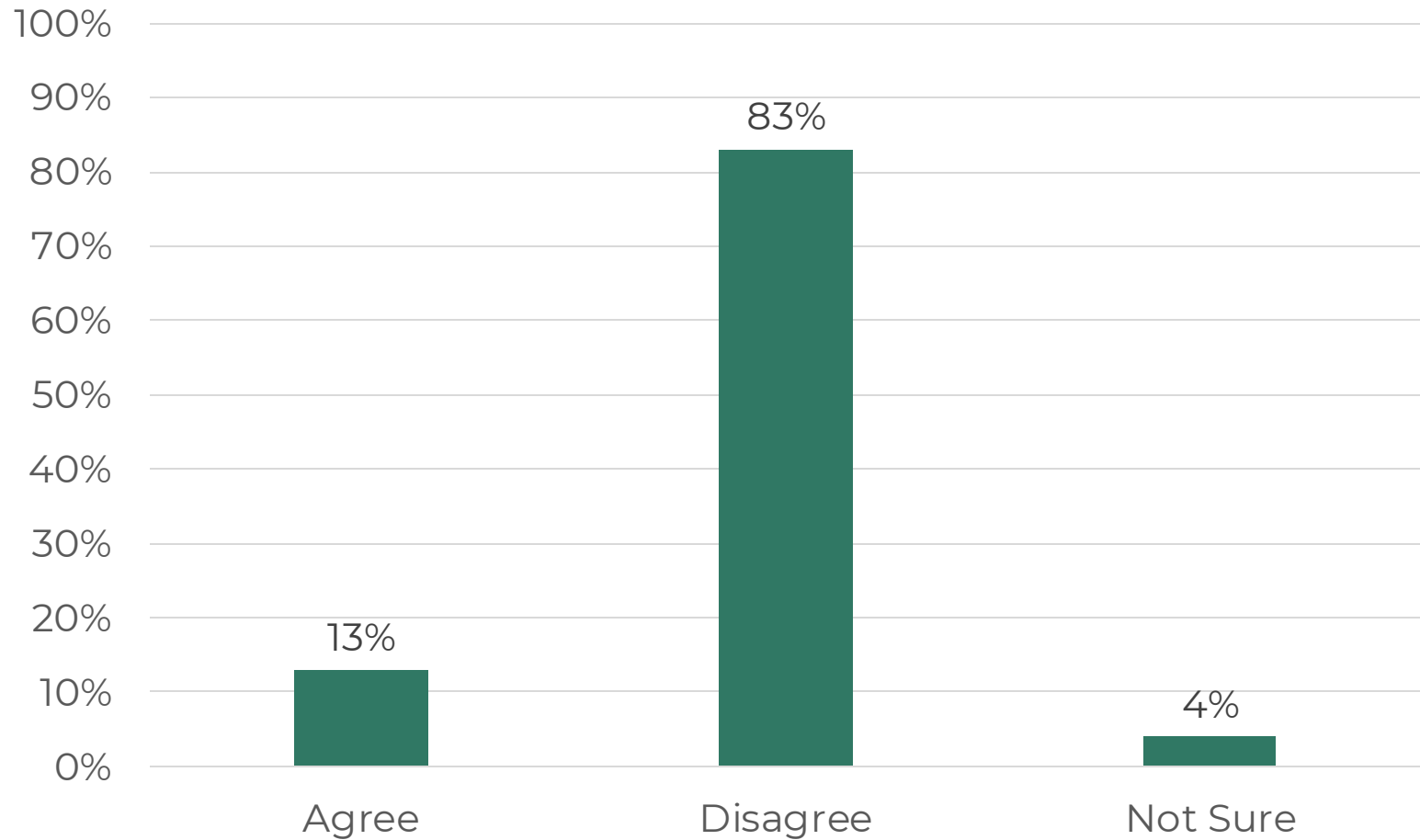
What percentage of evangelicals say that Christians have the responsibility to share truths from God's Word with people who hold different views?



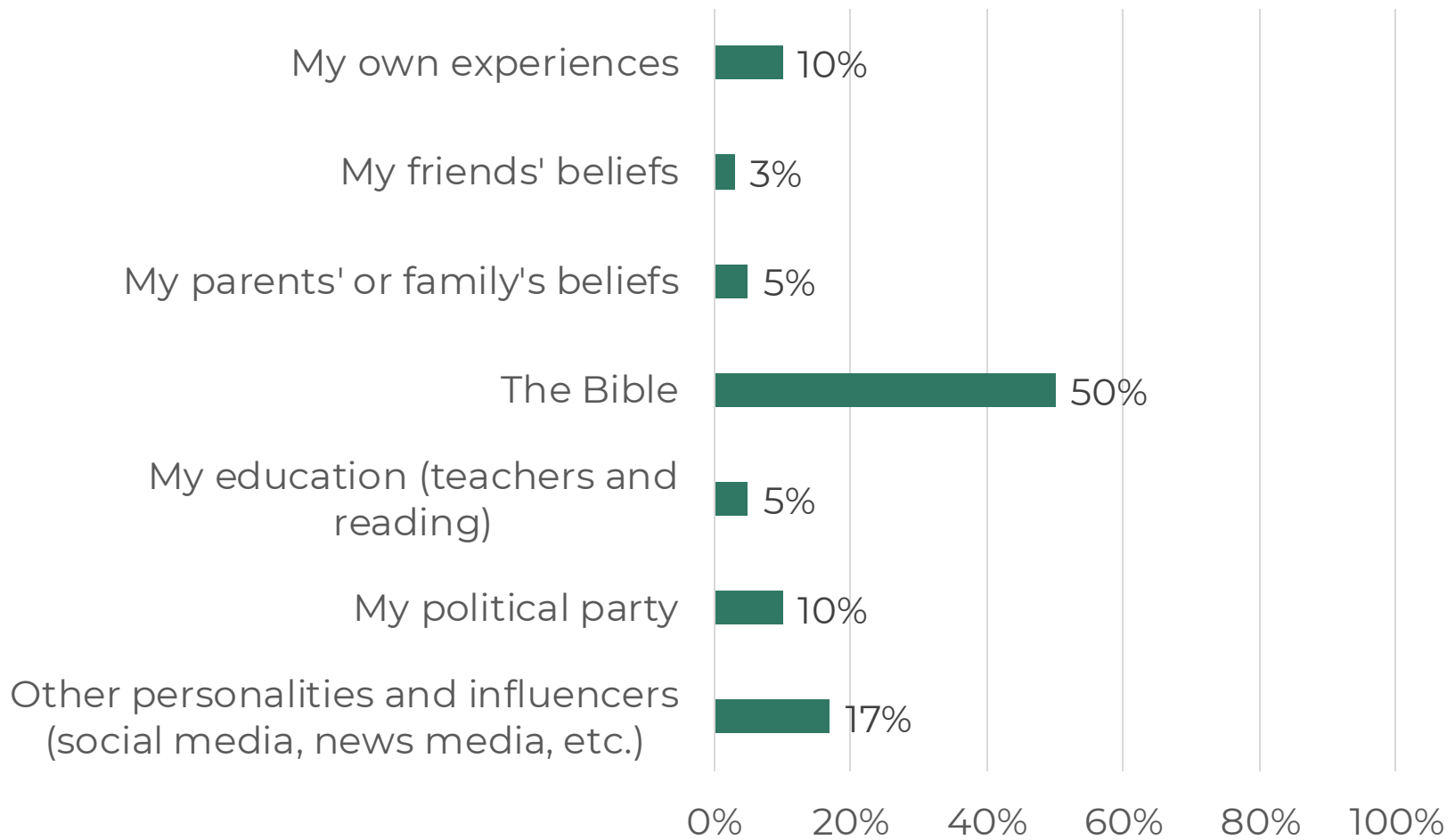
What percentage of evangelicals have trouble understanding how to apply the Bible's teaching to important questions in their life?



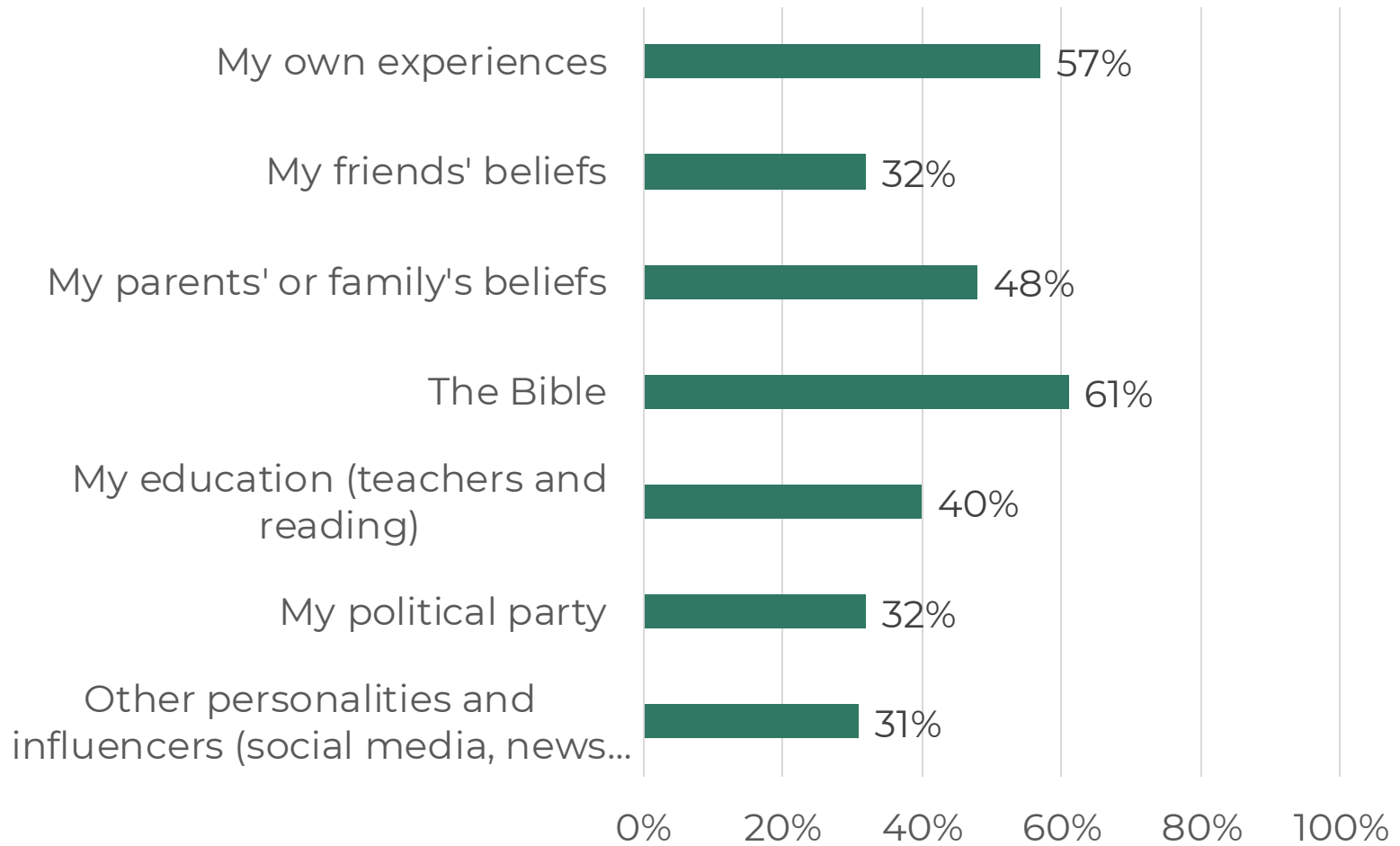
What percentage of evangelicals think the Bible is silent on most of the big questions our society is facing?



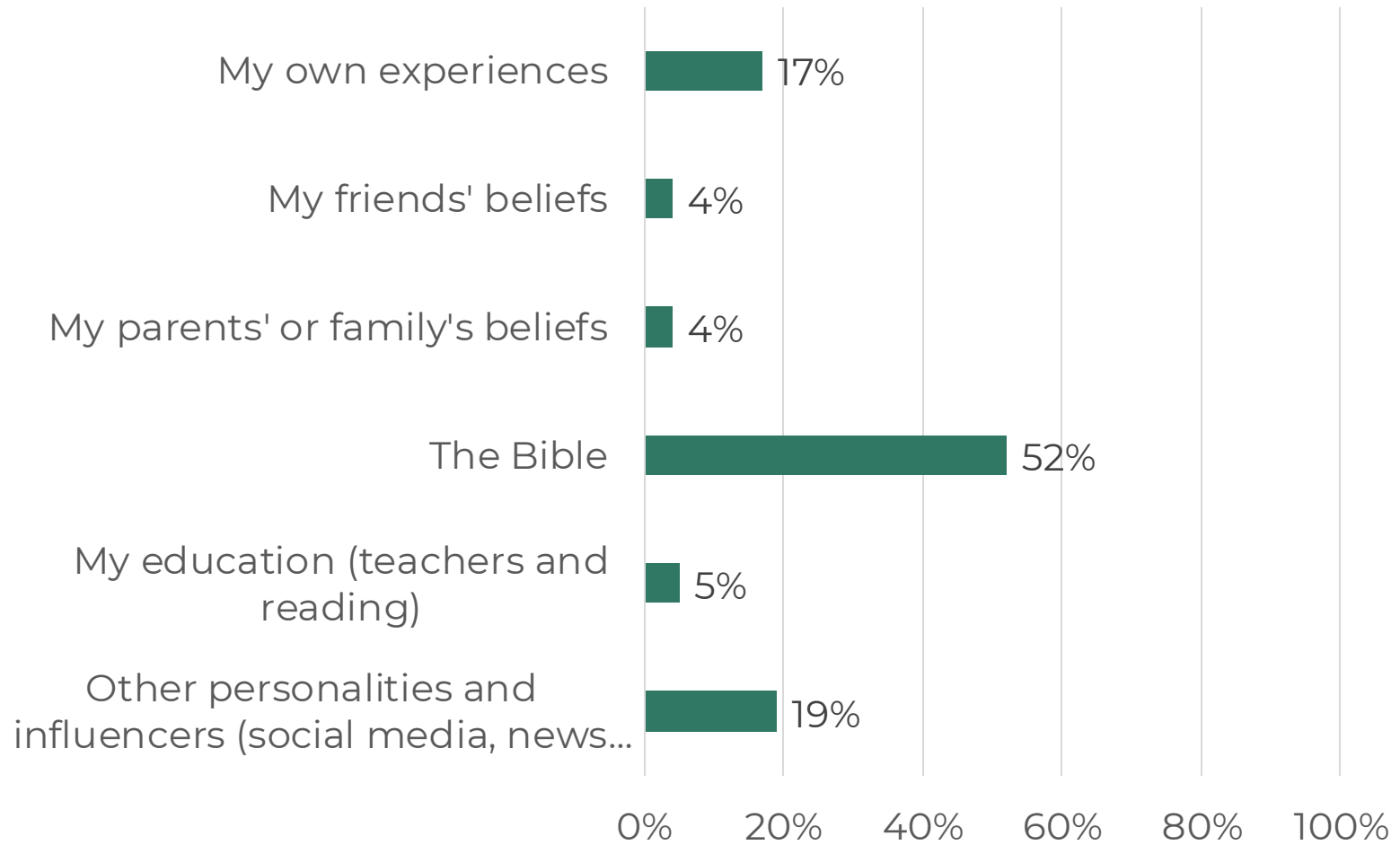
What is influencing evangelicals as they form opinions about solutions to problems in our society? (Top Choice)



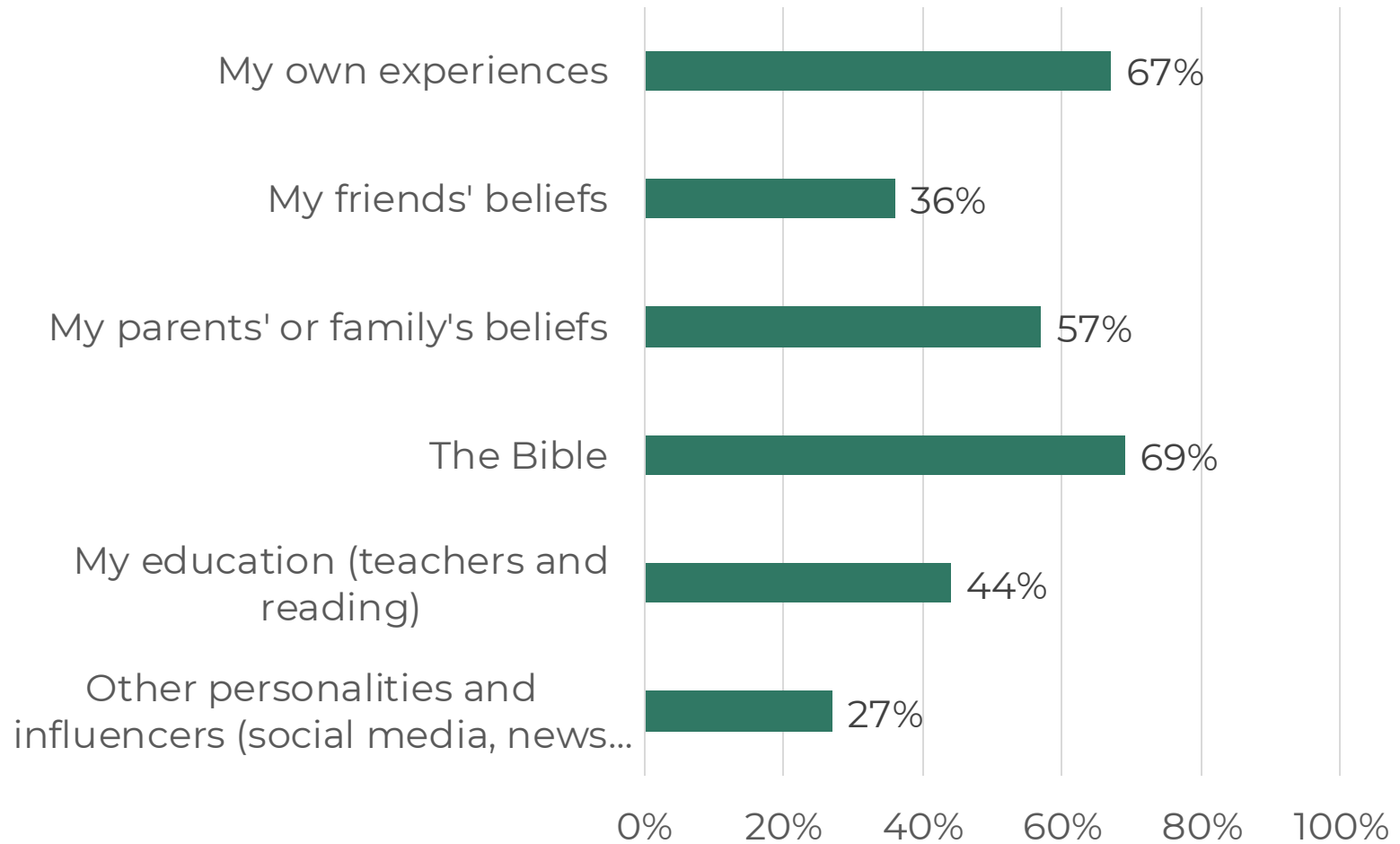
What is influencing evangelicals as they form opinions about solutions to problems in our society? (Top 3 Choices)



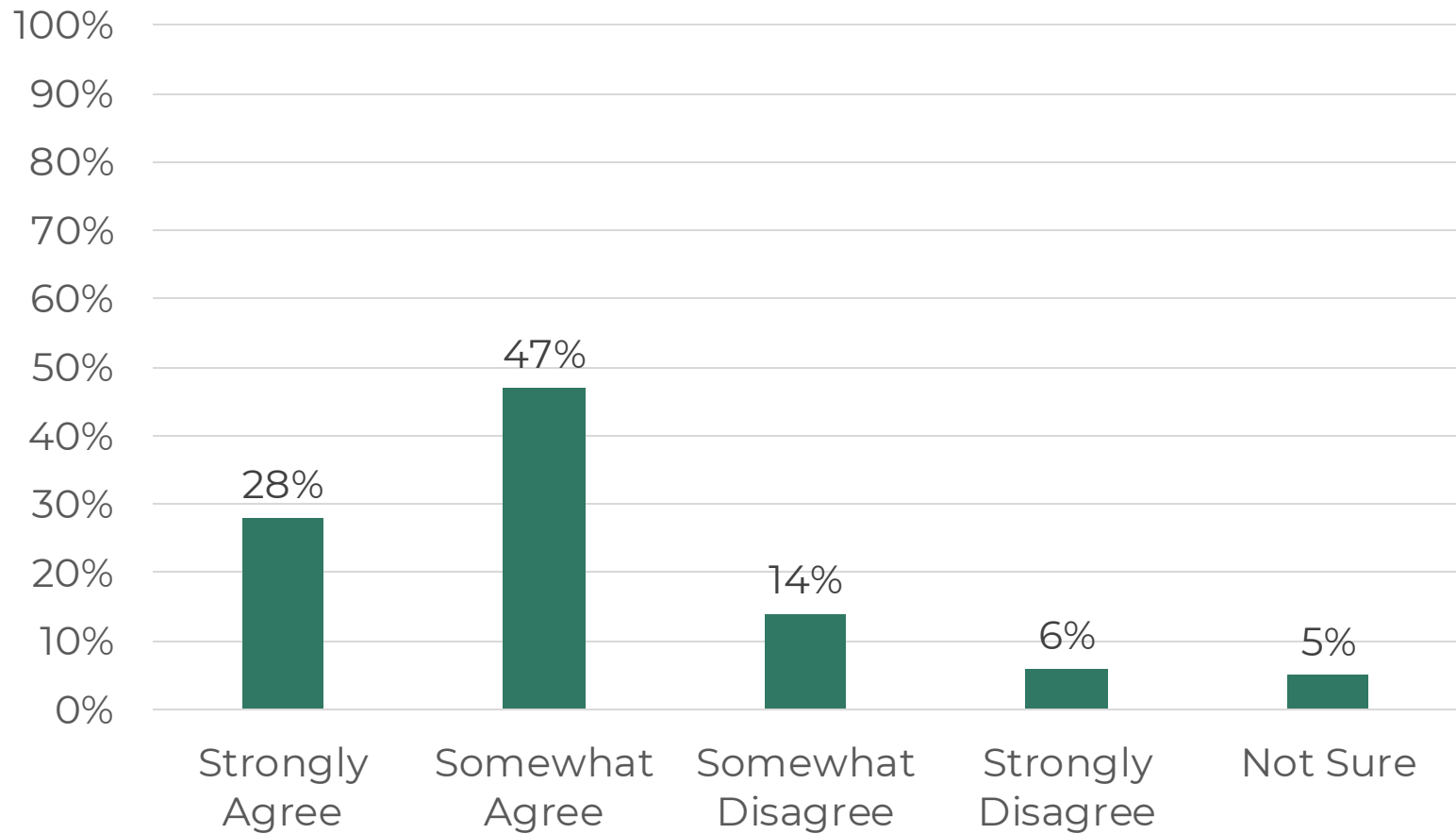
What is influencing evangelicals on personal decisions? (Top Choice)



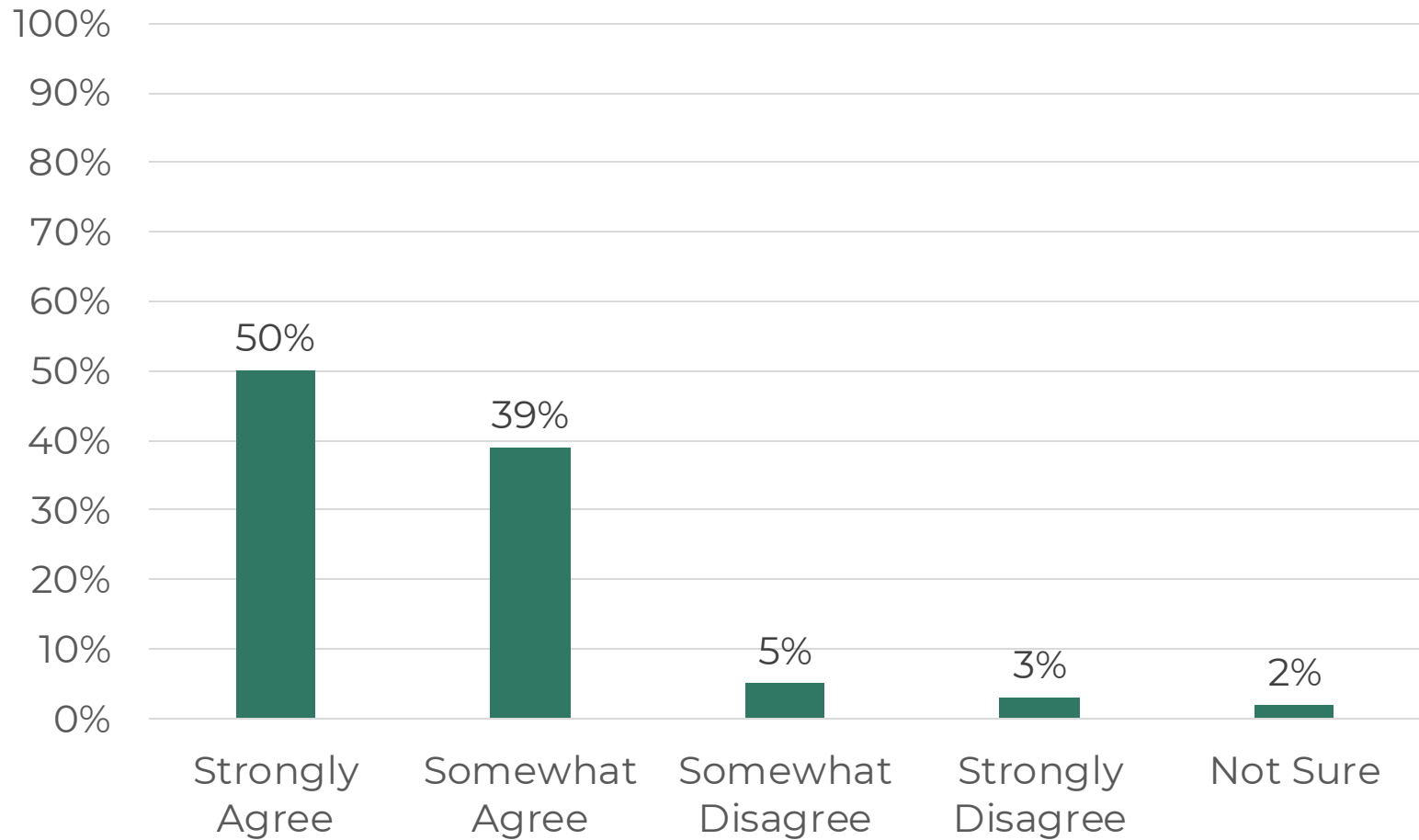

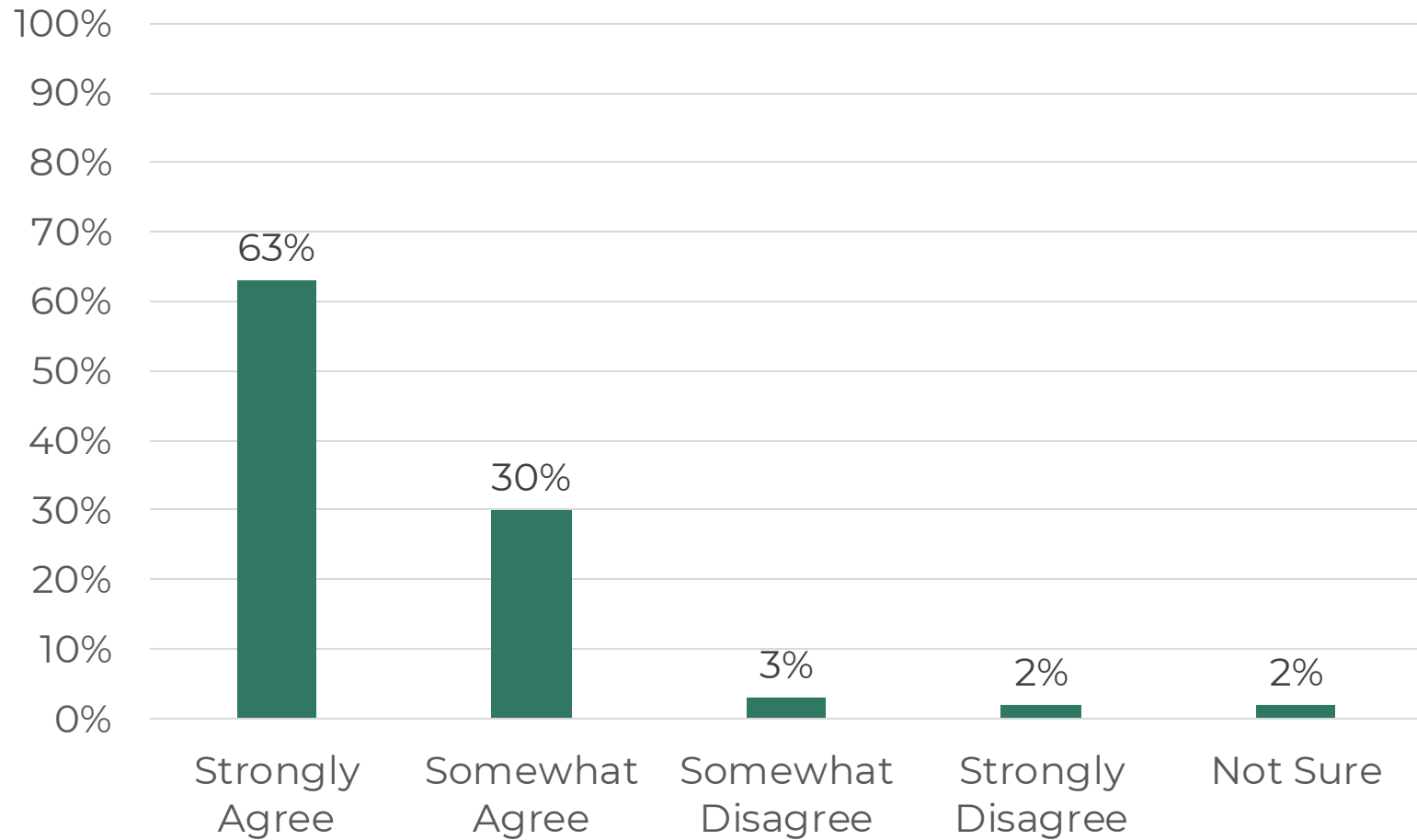
What percentage of evangelicals want to speak up when talking with someone who says something that doesn't align with Scripture?



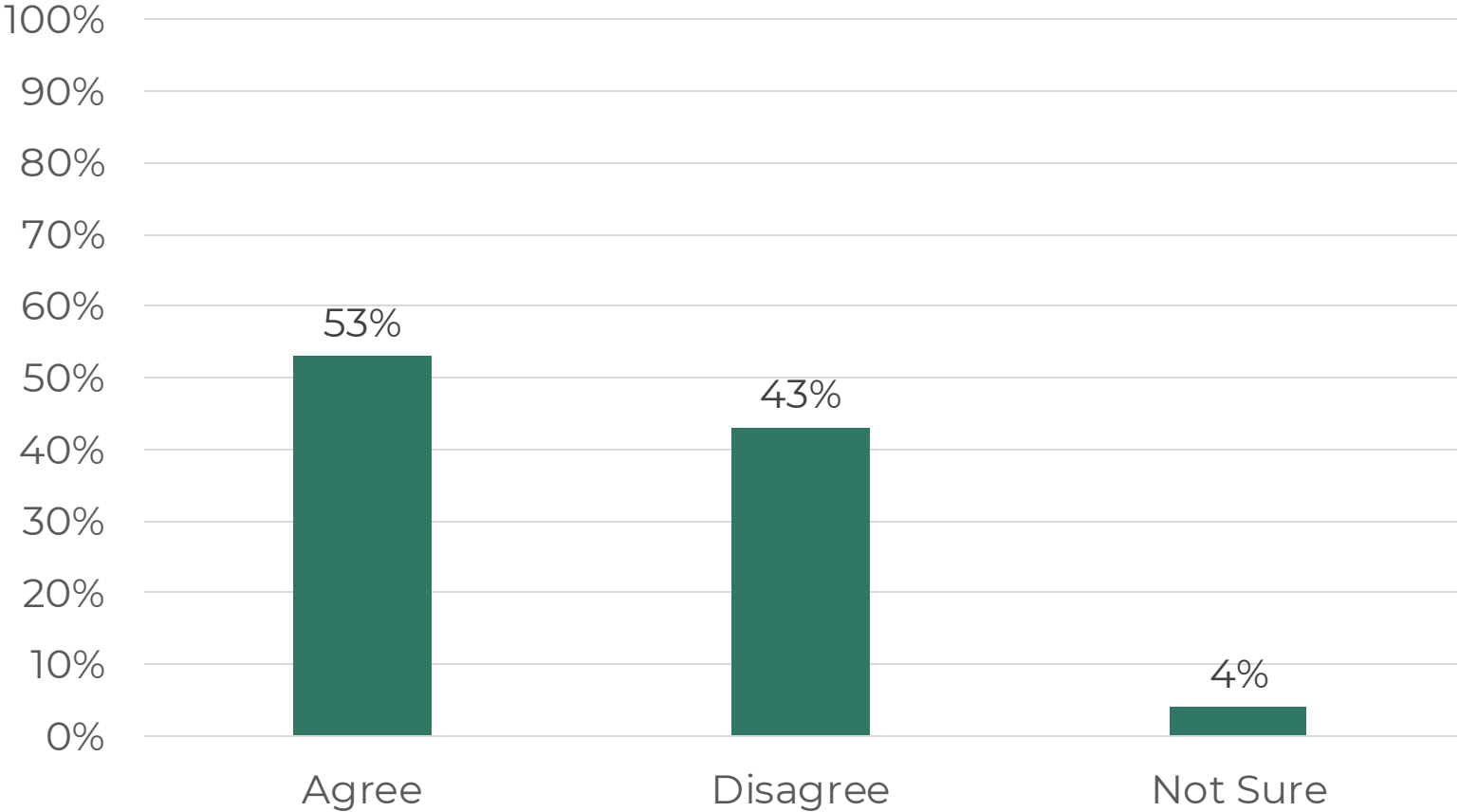
What percentage of evangelicals want to promote biblical truths among people they know?



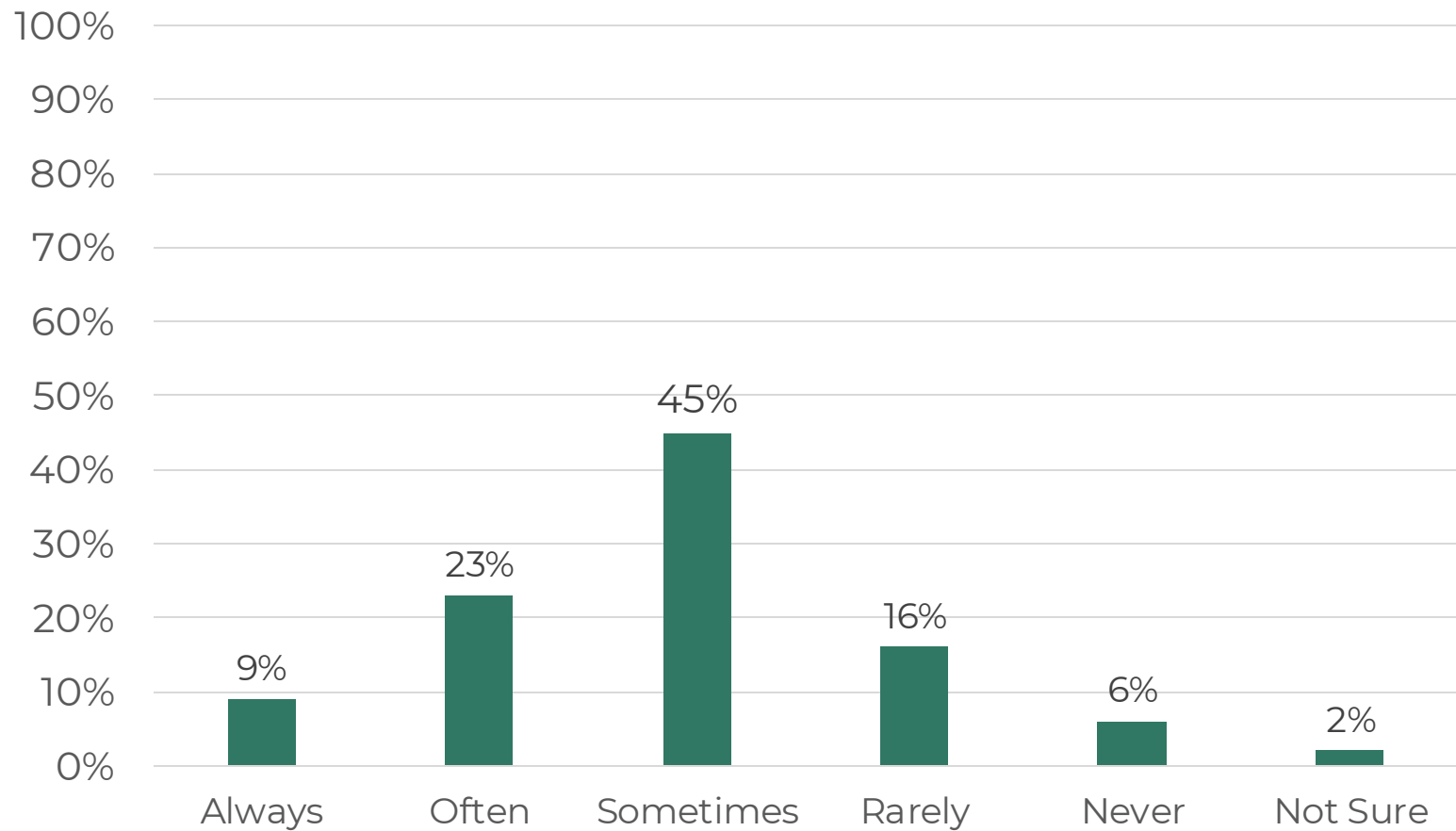
What percentage of evangelicals want to demonstrate biblical compassion to those outside their church?



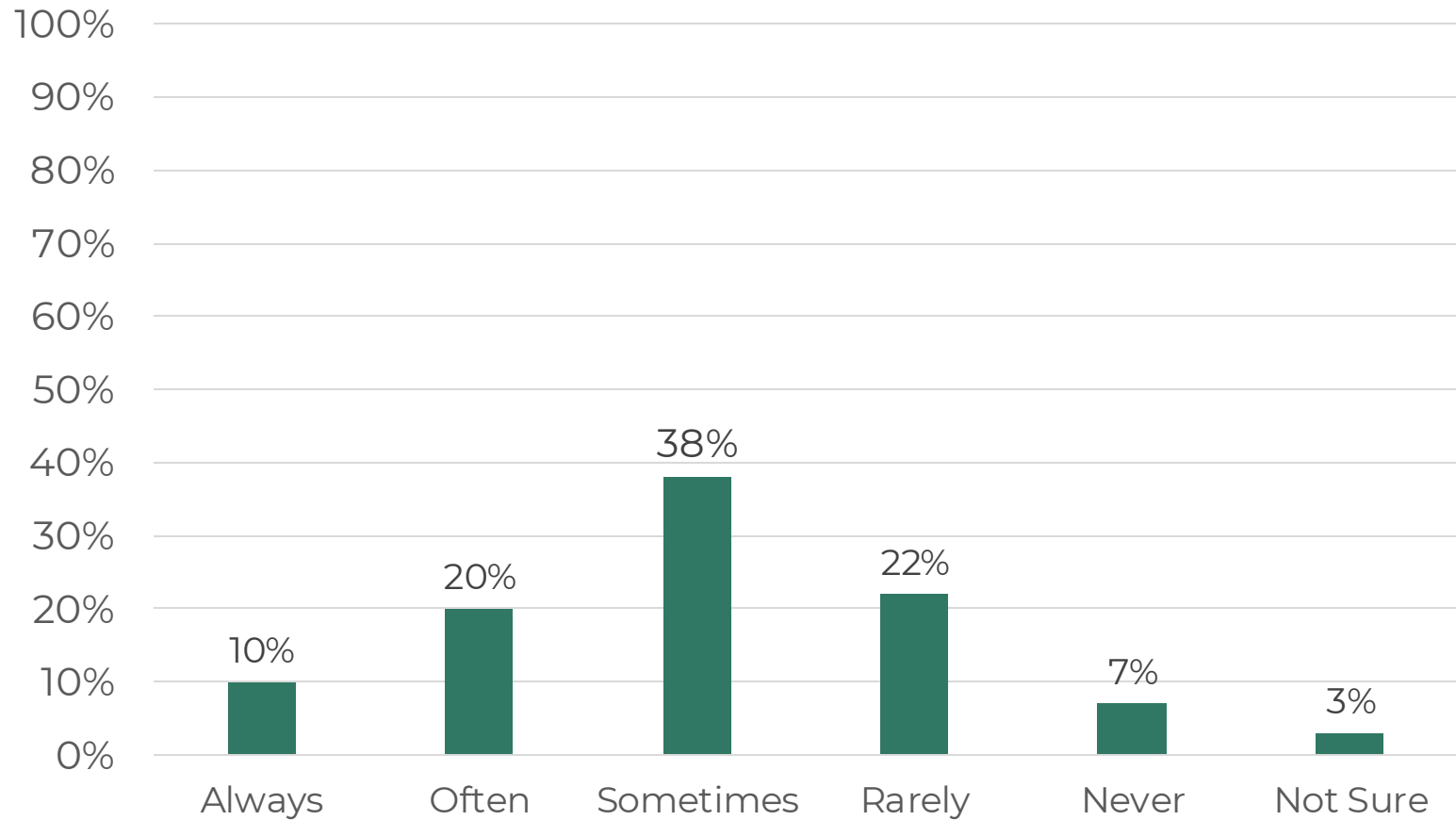
What percentage of evangelicals rarely have opportunities to engage in conversations with people who disagree with the Bible?



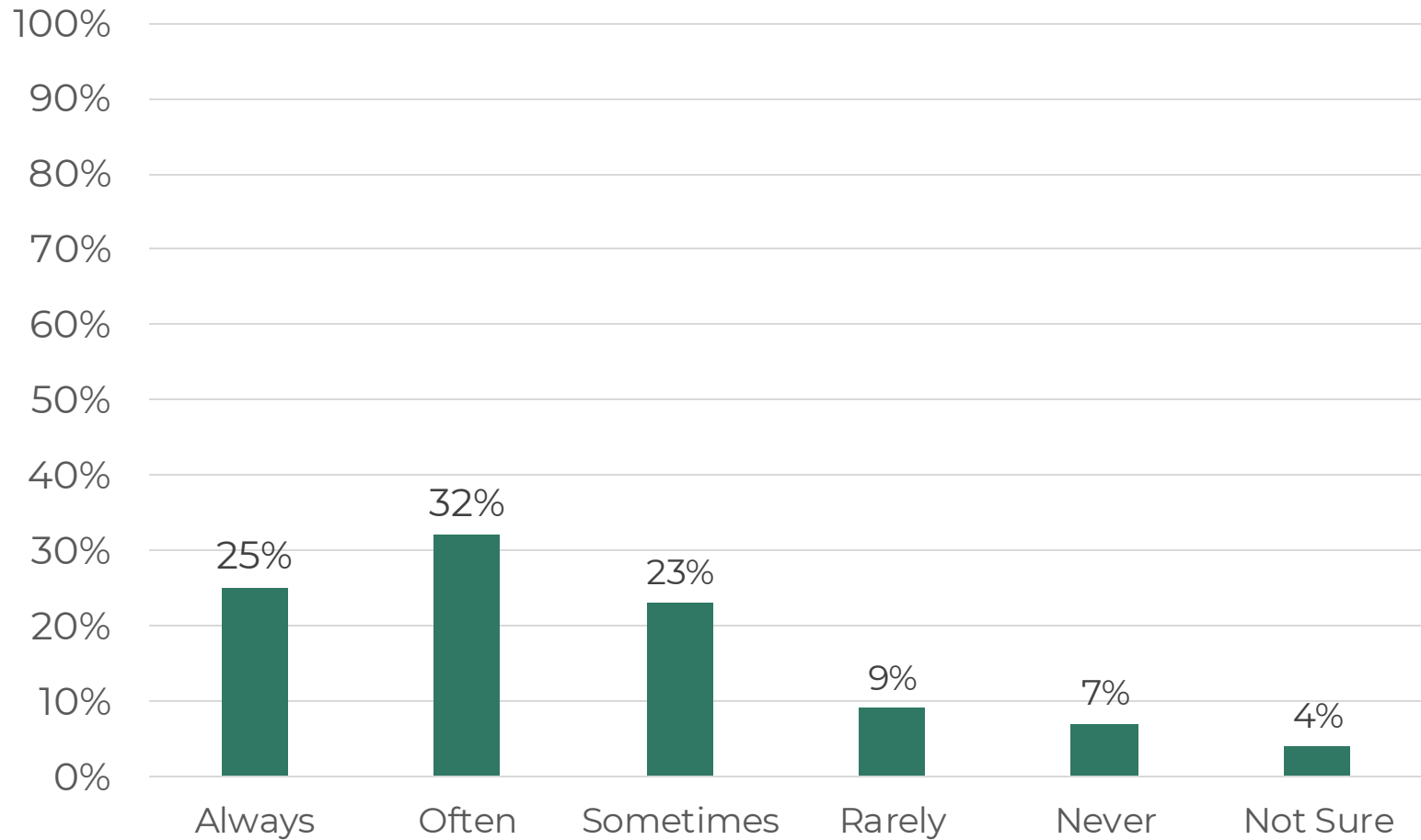
What percentage of evangelicals say they sometimes share a biblically informed view when someone says something that is not biblical?



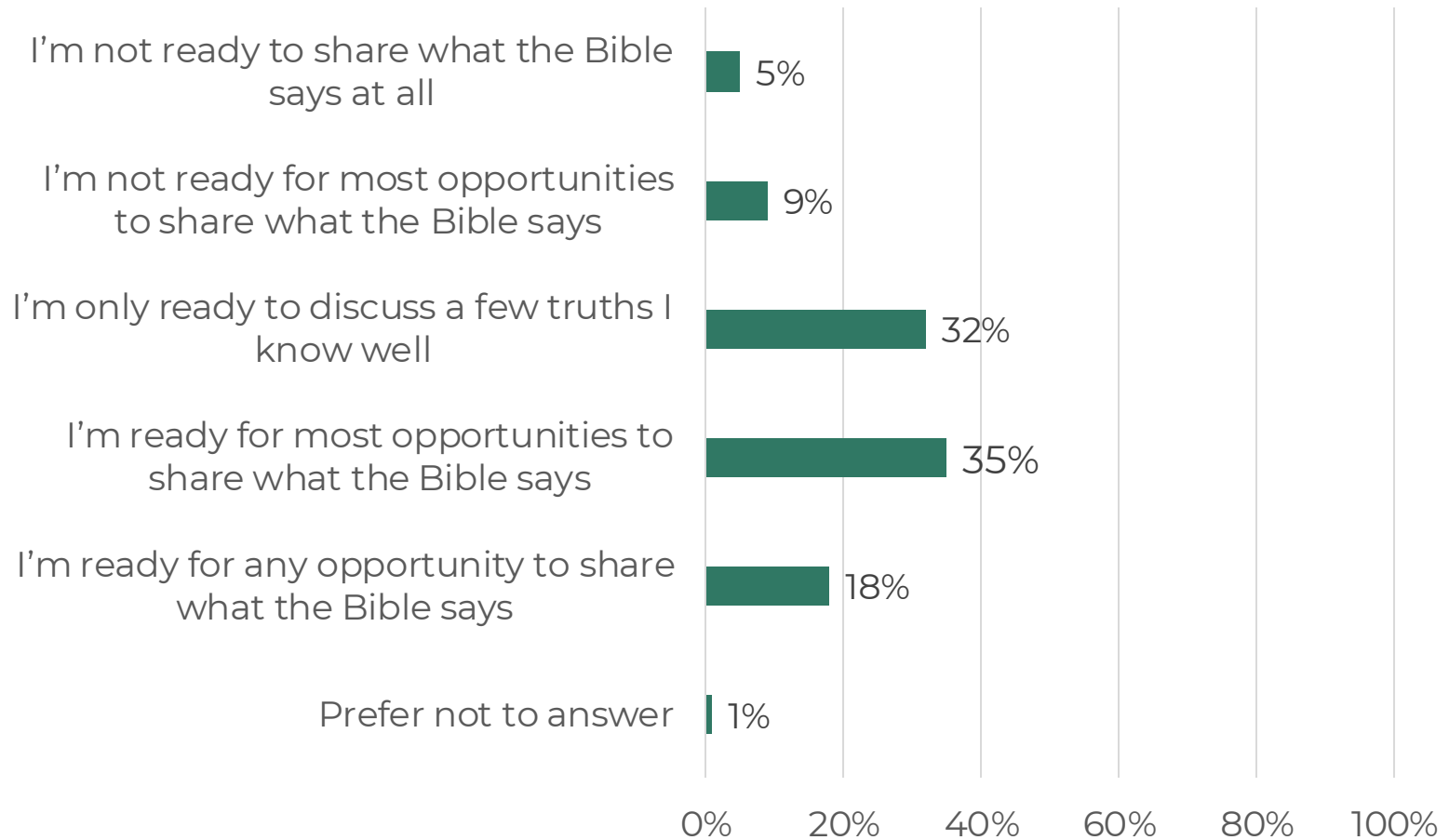
What percentage of evangelicals say they sometimes seek opportunities to promote the Bible's perspective on topics knowing they are not popular?



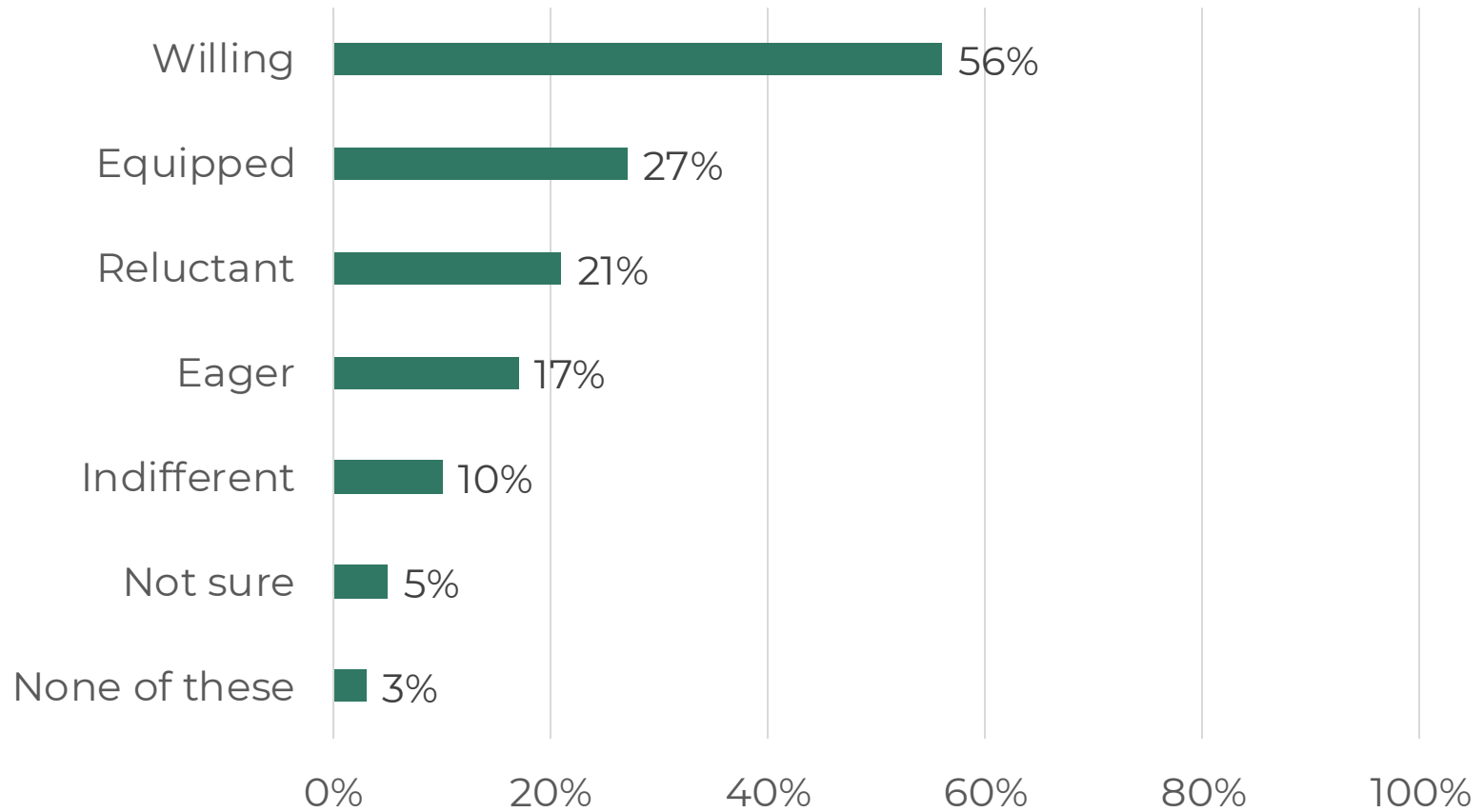
What percentage of evangelicals say they always or often test what they see in society against Scripture?



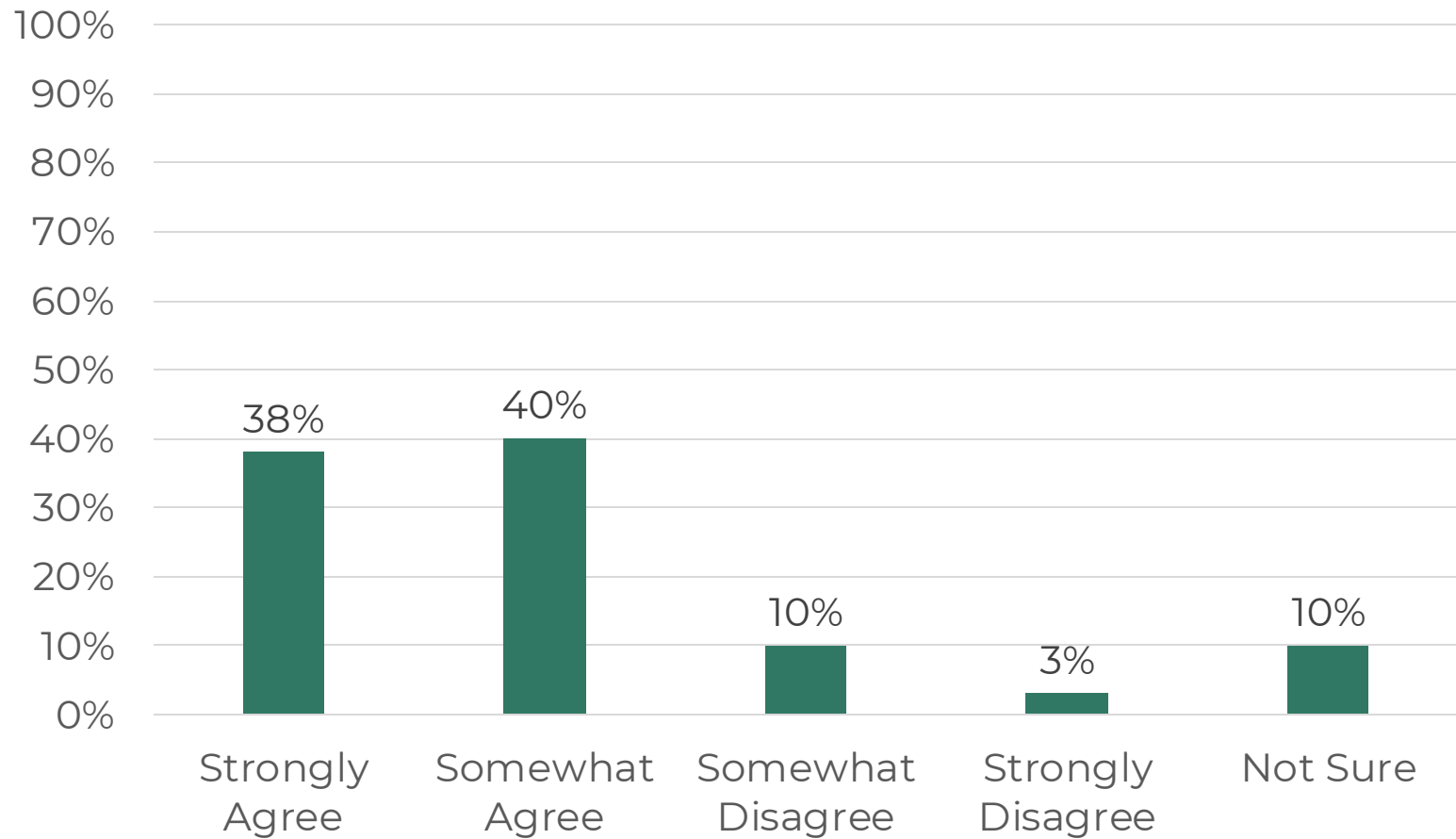
What percentage of evangelicals say they are ready for most opportunities to share what the Bible says about cultural and hot button issues?



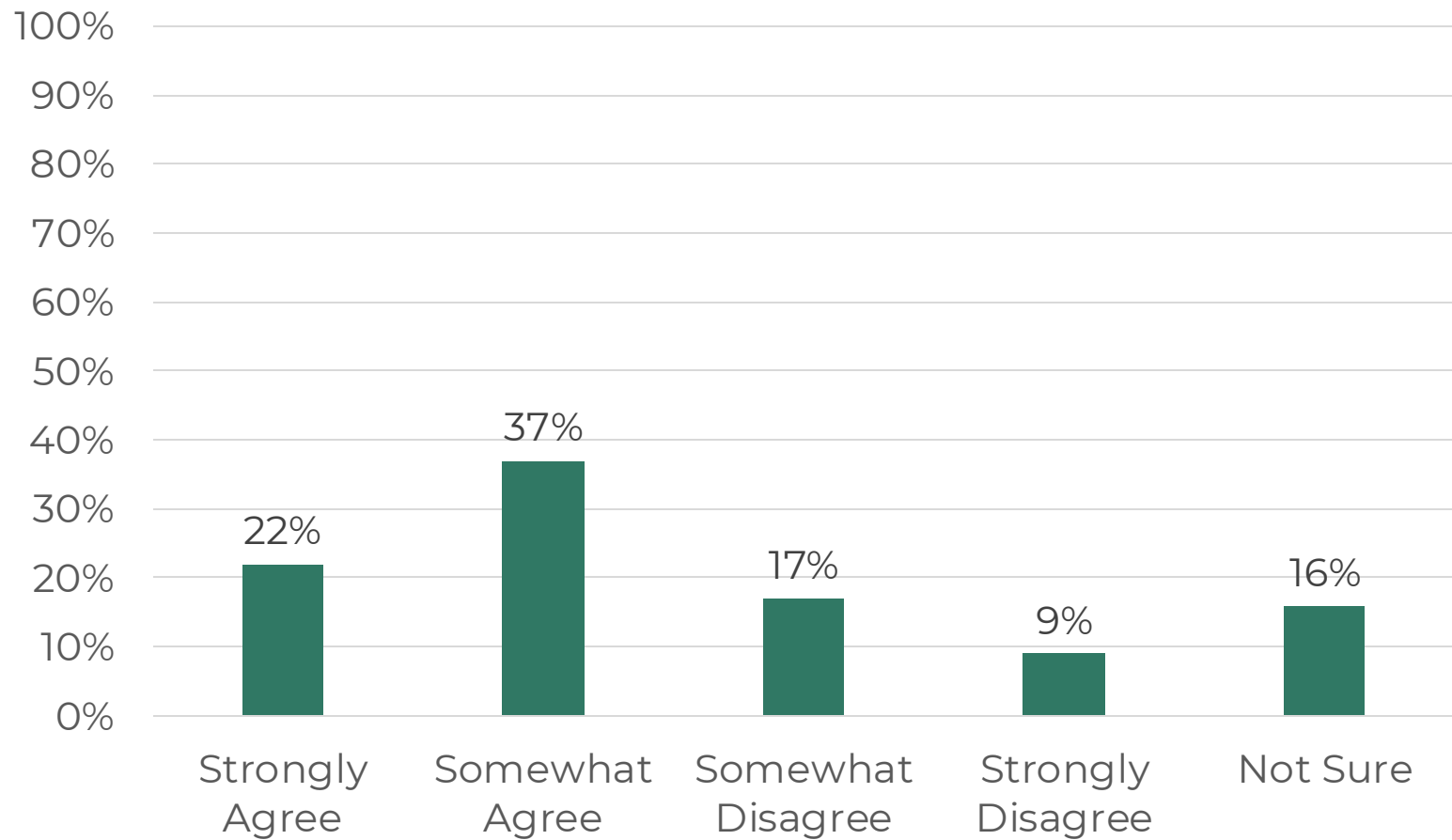
How do evangelicals describe how they feel about discussing biblical truths with people who disagree?



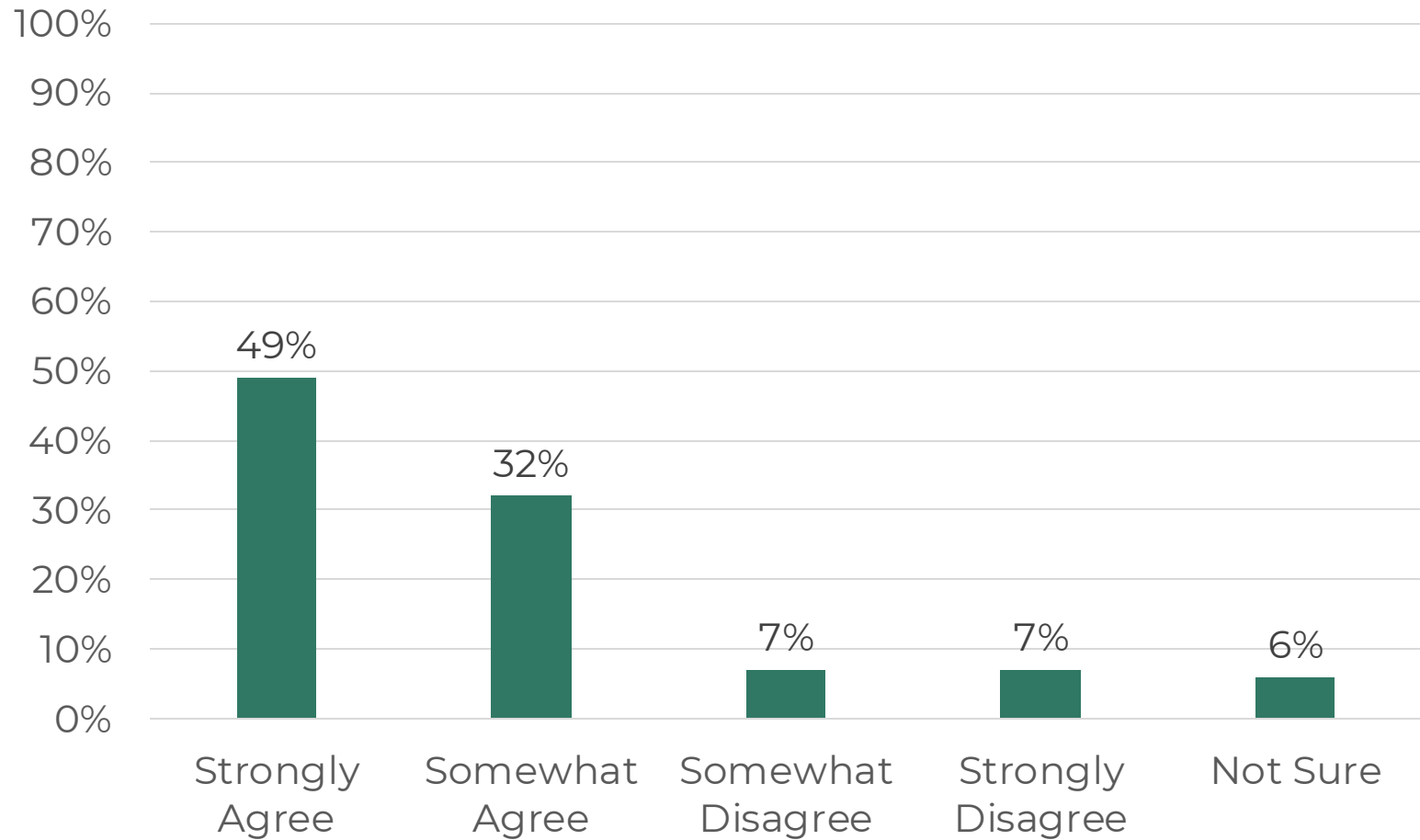
What percentage of evangelicals agree their church prepares them to have conversations with people whose views differ from the Bible?



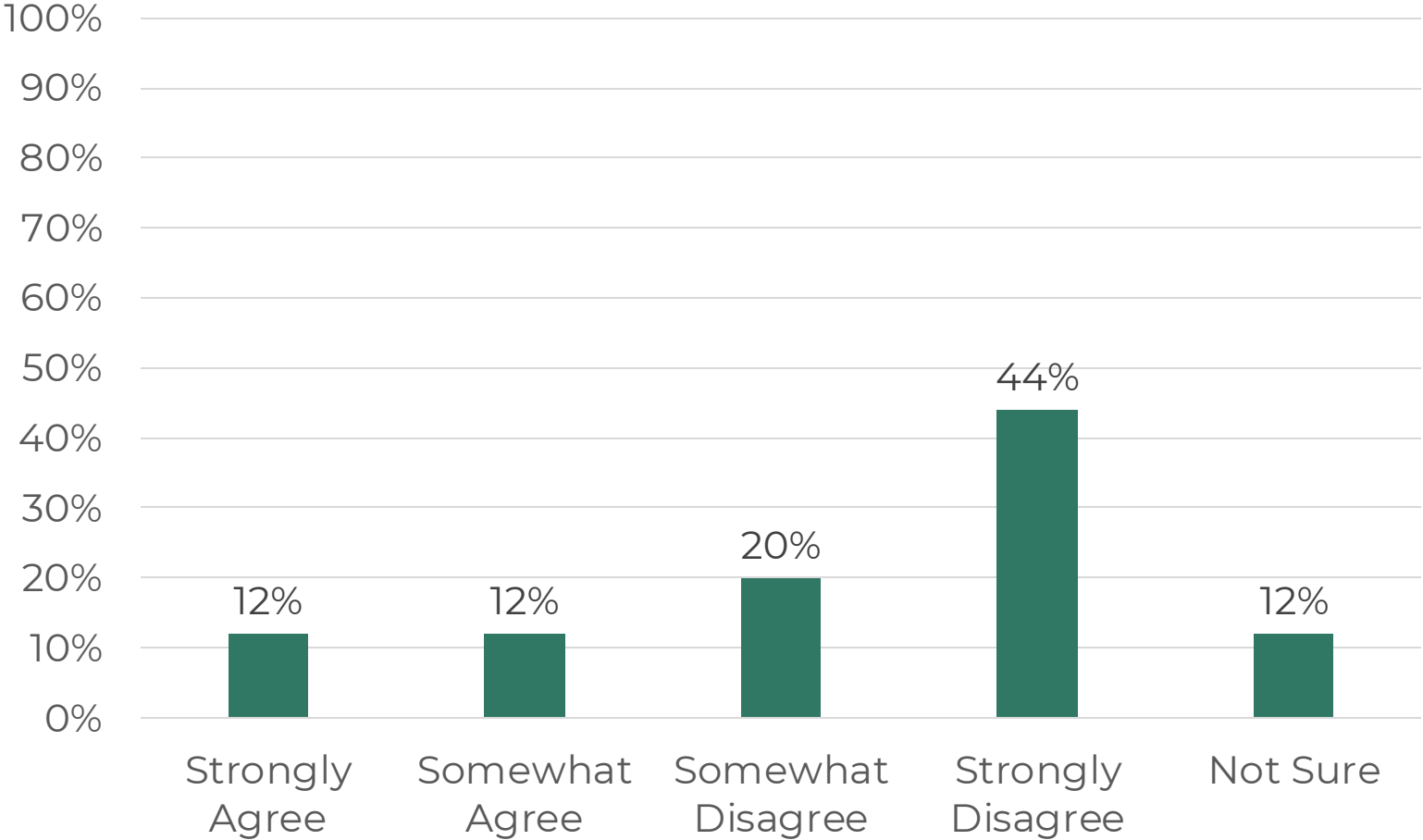
What percentage of evangelicals agree their church intentionally creates environments to discuss differences between our culture's values and the Bible's?



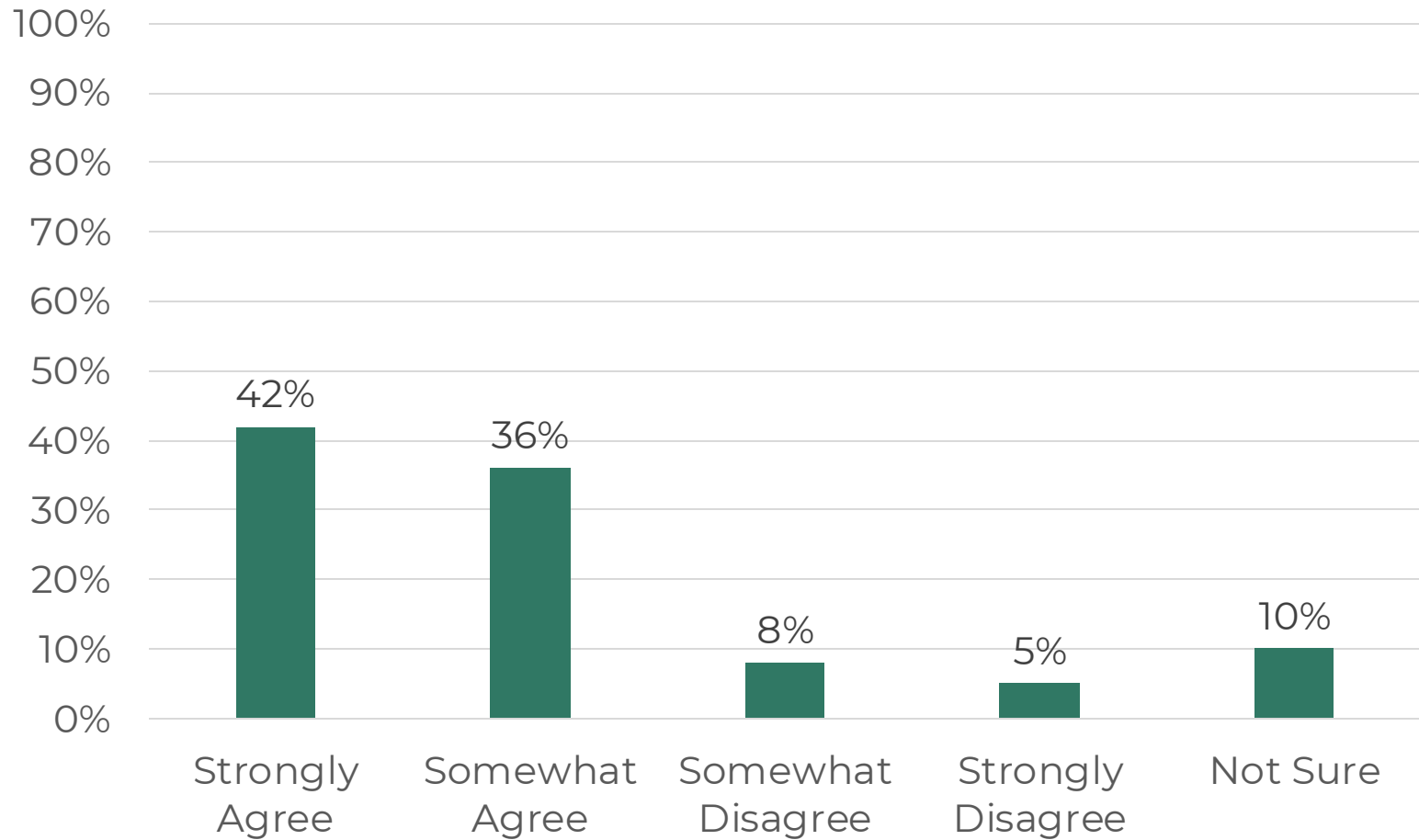
What percentage of evangelicals seek to make voting decisions by applying biblical truth to the issues and candidates?



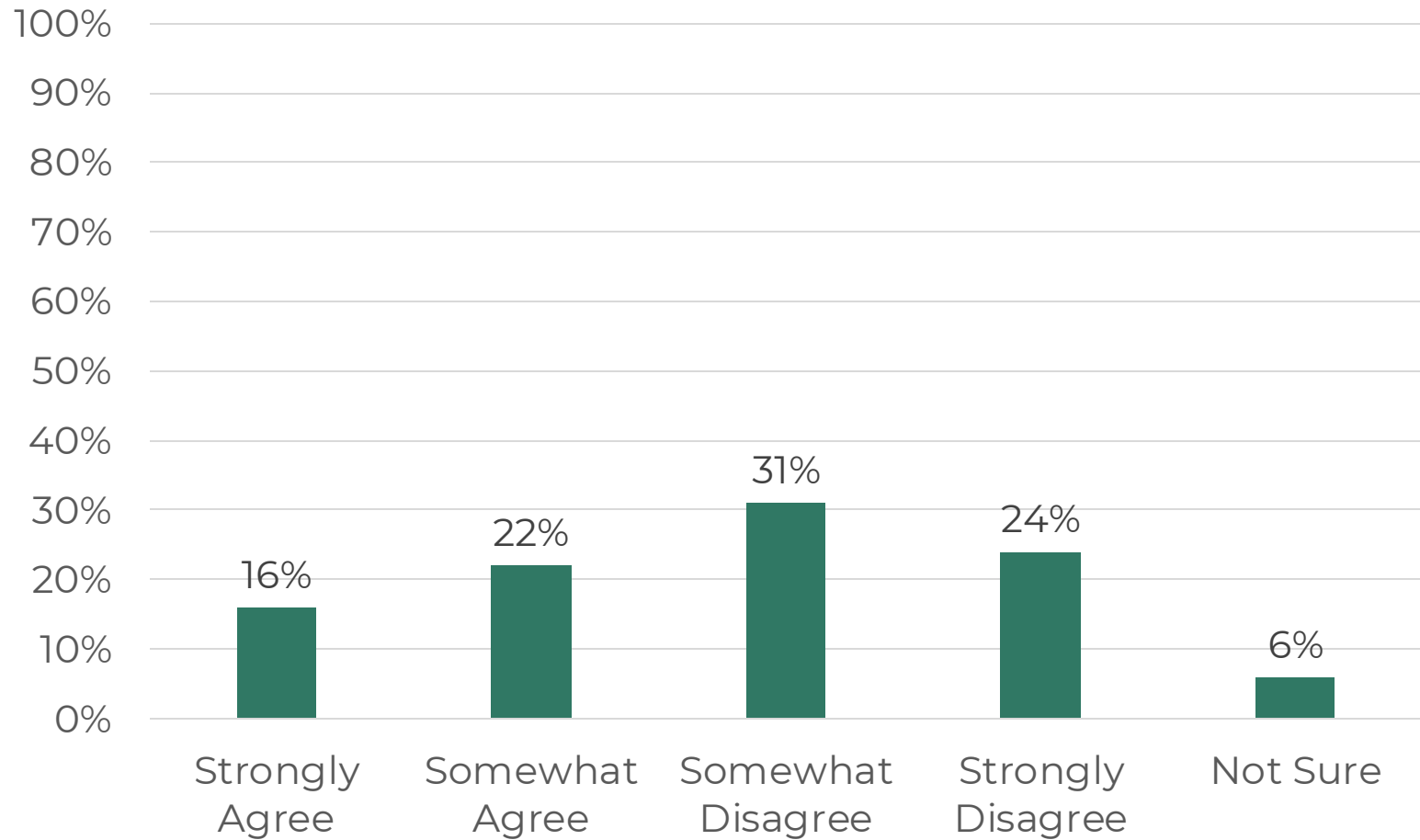
What percentage of evangelicals agree that God is unconcerned with if or how they vote?



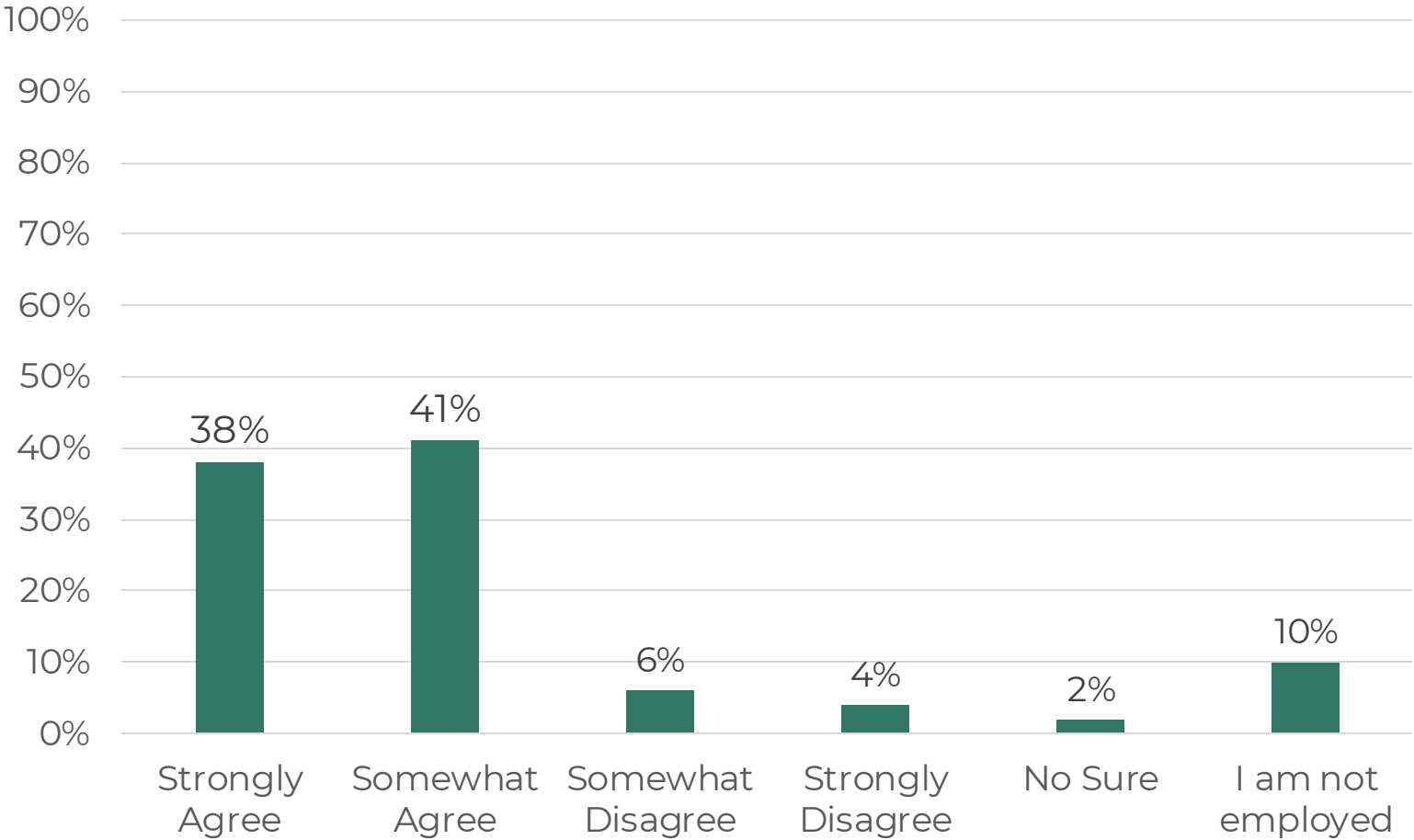
What percentage of evangelicals believe that work is a sacred gift from God?
